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OVERVIEW

It's been over a decade since the creation of the agile manifesto and agile development practices have matured beyond just a collection of team practices to an organizational philosophy for sustainably creating and delivering value. Organizations are now pushing agile well beyond the team environment agile methodologies were originally intended for and are realizing greater value in their programs and even in their project portfolios. We have learned a great deal in the last decade and it's time for a new introduction to agile development that explains agile concepts beyond team practices. In this new introduction, participants will gain a perspective on agile that is often not well addressed in the textbooks and yet necessary for understanding agile in the organization. The purpose of this workshop is to develop a broad understanding and appreciation of state of the art agile and lean philosophies and their realization in specific practices. Participants will be able to use the understanding and knowledge gained in this workshop to begin planning how they too can sustainably improve project outcomes by creating and delivering greater value faster to their stakeholders.

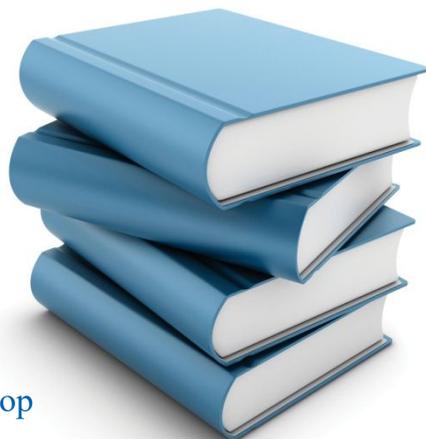
